

**Calling on the Triple GGG
to Heal a Broken or Wounded Heart**

Now that I am healed, what does my healing mean to God and me?

How odd would it be to say, “God, thank You for healing my broken heart so I can go back to the pigpen.” Has this ever happened? Unfortunately, yes. It’s crucial to understand that being healed and set free from the pain of your past is an integral part of God’s plan for your life. Why? When you get back on track and start doing things God’s way, He is able to use the talents and gifts He gave you. By experiencing God’s healing, you now have a tangible point of reference that demonstrates that God is *real* and He loves to the uttermost.

God’s *Zoopoieo* power floods us with His love so that
we overflow. In Christ, walls of isolation come
down as we shed His love abroad.

Moreover, whether you have received mental, physical, or spiritual healing, your authentic transformation is observable to the people in your life. When your brokenness is transformed into wholeness, it is easy for others to see how God has changed you. You are a display of God’s goodness because people you know will witness God breaking down the walls of isolation.

But there is more, much more. The new liberty you have allows you to take God’s restoration, redemption, freedom, and sound mind outward to the people in your life. Because you have “been there,” you have a living testimony of God’s redemptive love and power. This is something that you could not have done before you received Christ. This is because you previously had an inward focus. But as a Christian, the Holy Spirit

has transformed your heart so that you can love others unselfishly without expecting anything in return. Even so, you must allow God to work in you, and through you, to reach others with His love. You do this by courageously yielding to God's still small voice that speaks His Word to you.

As we learned earlier, the “*cares of this world*” will severely diminish how God can use us. This is because our trust comes into question when the “cares” distract us from God and His plans for us. However, when we yield to God, we are displaying our trust in Him. This is precisely where God wants us. Matthew 6:32-33 says it this way: “...*your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and He will give you everything you need.*”

God wants to be God in your life, and when you allow Him, by yielding to Him, His blessing will flow to you and through you. There are many Scripture references where God says, “*Obey My voice, and I will be your God, and you shall be My people. And walk in all the ways that I have commanded you, that it may be well with you.*” *NKJV*

Yieldedness and dependency are two touchstone attributes that we aspire to have as Christians. When we are yielded and dependant upon God, we are placing every care and concern into His hands. This depth of submission enables God to use us dynamically. —Ω
